The journey of Appanoose County residents who were of African-American descent will be uncovered in this presentation by renowned author and historian Enfys McMurry during the Appanoose County Historical Society's Annual Meeting on Monday, April 27, at 7:00 pm at the Centerville City Hall.

Enfys McMurry spent many years as an instructor at Indian Hills Community College and has authored the book, "Hearst's Other Castle". The book that Enfys is currently working on is exciting to all of us Appanoose County History buffs. Enfys is documenting history, as seen through the eyes of the Centerville, Iowa town square. Events that shaped our town, our country, and our world over the past 160 years have been discussed daily in the heart of our county seat – The Centerville Square. Enfys' mission to view history via the lens of the Centerville Square - will provide readers with a fascinating microcosm of society in America throughout all of the growth and prosperity, depression and wartime in America's history.

As Enfys' research for this book has progressed, she has uncovered the very interesting journey that has been taken by African-Americans in Appanose County. The Underground Railroad through Appanose County was an example of our county's humanity and judgment in the mid-1800's, but there have also been eras of intolerance and hatred. The racial tone of the county has evolved into different directions over the course of time, and that extends to other ethnic groups as well.

Come and learn about this fascinating slice of Appanoose County history at the Annual Meeting of the Appanoose County Historical Society.

Aaaah! It's finally warming up outside and inside at the museum! We invite you to come in and see some of the newly donated items and displays that are in place.

We would like to thank everyone who has donated items to the museum. We have received several items in the past few months, including the large Great Seal of Iowa that had most recently hung in the Appanoose County Courthouse, and was donated by Kris Koestner of the J&K Market. We also have received a large photocopy of the 1906 City of Centerville map from Lyle Kesterson, which will allow us to store the original for safe keeping. A lovely friendship quilt was donated by the

family of Clifford & Letha Whicker, and a nice collection of items and photos that tell the story of Slick Kauzlarich's shoe repair business. The recently disbanded BPW organization also donated some of their items and scrapbooks. My own family donated some items as well - The Helen Johnson book, "Rural Schools of Appanoose County", was donated by my parents, Gary & Dorothy Barrickman, and a journal that documents the depression era business dealings of Appanoose County resident Fred Herr was donated by my in-laws, George & Mary Eddy.

There are two new small displays you might enjoy. We have created a small exhibit recognizing Carl Weeks, founder of Armand Cosmetics, original owner / builder of the

Salisbury House in Des Moines, and former Centerville resident and business owner. He was a druggist on the south side of the square before he became rich and famous!

Another small display recognizes James Stevens, author of many books that mostly deal with life in the Pacific Northwest and logging , most notably the book, "Paul Bunyan". James Stevens was born in Albia, but spent much of his childhood years living with his grandmother in Iconium. Another of his books, called "Brawnyman", includes a character called "Appanoose Jim".

We are continuing to collect pieces that cumulatively tell the story of Appanoose County, so if you would like to donate an artifact, please bring it by the museum!

#### 2009 Showing of "The Wonderful Thing"

On April 3, the Appanoose County Historical Society presented the movie, "The Wonderful Thing" at Simon Estes Auditorium. As you might recall, this 1921 silent movie had several outdoor scenes filmed right here in Appanoose County.

The first time we showed the film, we were able to bring the movie full circle and show it at the Majestic Theater, where the movie originally was shown in October of 1921. However, this year, we were unable to show it at the Majestic, so we opted to show it at the Simon Estes Auditorium. The auditorium does not have a screen, so Historical Society board member, Gary

Cridlebaugh, used his ingenuity to come up with a screen to show the movie on. We'd like to thank the Chamber of Commerce for allowing us to borrow it, and thanks to Gary for getting it painted and set up to be used as our screen - it worked great!
